Task Context:

Throughout the term, you have explored the concept of being part of a family. In this task, you will construct a multimodal 'pecha kucha' presentation which represents your idea of what it means to be part of a family.

Task Description:

Your task is to create a pecha kucha slideshow exploring the concept of being part of a family. Your pecha kucha should contain 20 slides featuring photographs of people and/or things that you feel visually represent your idea of what it means to be part of a family. Each image should be accompanied by a 20 second voiceover discussing the content of your slide.

Ideas for slides might include:

- The family home
- Places your family likes to go
- Something your family likes to do
- Your extended family

You are permitted to use internet images if you are having difficulty finding your own photos.

- Discuss the concept of being part of a family
- · Create an engaging pecha kucha
- Select and explain images
- Use appropriate text structure, language, spelling and grammar
