Submission Instructions: Students are to email assessment to westernlap@det.nsw.edu.au prior to 9.00am on Monday 26th February 2024. As part of the Study Days in Week 7, Students will set up a display of works, the assessment submissions will be utilised for a learning activity where students will present their ideas and concepts to the class. Students are expected to present their concept for approximately 5mins and then answer questions by peers.

Task Context:

In Visual Arts you have learnt about a variety of art movements, art critics and historians, artists and their practices through our case studies. You have learnt about the Frames, Conceptual Framework, Material and Conceptual Framework through these critical and historical investigations.

In this task you will submit a body of work as part of the HSC examination for Visual Arts. In this body of work, students should demonstrate their understanding of artmaking as a practice, represent their ideas and interests through their interpretation of subject matter and use of expressive forms.

The production of a body of work involves the development, investigation and extension over time, of conceptual and material understanding in artmaking. You should consider your own resolve in selecting works for examination with a view to representing a coherent point of view and in relation to the conceptual strength and meaning of works produced. The Body of Work must be conceived of, and executed, by the student under the supervision of the Visual Arts teacher. The Body of Work must comply with the overall prescribed dimensions for HSC submitted artworks in Visual Arts Stage 6 in terms of overall limitations on size, weight, volume and duration as set out in Assessment and Reporting in Visual Arts Stage 6.

1a Artmaking/Discussion

The assessment of your artmaking will consider your artmaking of objects and visual images as well as your experimentation in media, material and conceptual practice.

The <u>WHAT IS A BODY OF WORK</u> and <u>WHERE DO I START PROJECT</u> resource will help you in getting started in your VAPD and artmaking practice and provide you with ideas for artmaking.

You will be assessed on your attempt at the below activities as a part of your artmaking on:

- Notes and experimentations that you make in your VAPD. Not necessarily on the quality of the work but the
 application to developing work. It is as important to keep a record of failures as it is to keep your success work
 in the development of your Body of Work.
- Sketches, plans and diagrams that outline your intentions.
- Annotations on your sketches, photographs.
- Completed maguettes, preparatory studies or exploration of skills and materials and techniques.
- Exploring available sources for materials and production of your work.
- You should research suppliers of resources and costs as well as have a clear understanding of the BOSTES size, weight, scale and materials limitations.
- Exploring various materials, papers, paints, pastels, oil crayons, pencil, photopapers and printing resources, assembled materials, media, processes, techniques and applications in your Visual Arts diary.
- Make artworks that demonstrate your material practice and experimentation with style, technique and skill.
- Making of artworks in a variety of forms that demonstrate your experimentation with practice and exploration of your concept.
- Make artworks that demonstrate your conceptual practice.

Your submission will include your VAPD and may include –

- a series of photographs,
- a canvas painting or a number of experimental paintings on paper, you may explore qualities of paper,
- a series of videos, vessels, forms, art objects, sculptures as exploration of EXPRESSIVE FORM.
- A series of prints, documented forms, textile investigations, etc

In your **discussion with your teachers** you will need to clearly outline your intentions conceptually and materially **(Artist Practice).** You will need to discuss with your teacher what constitutes a reasonable submission for this part of the task. Artwork submissions may vary from 10 painted canvases to 500 photographic images **in PDF** with a selection of 10 being printed – plus support experimentation and research in a VAPD. Your submission may be a series of drawings on paper. It is expected that you experiment on a range of surfaces and with a range of materials to meet requirements for exploring media and materials. This needs to be discussed with your art teacher and reflect your work practices. Work outside of your VAPD as well as inside of it.











1b. Expression of artistic intent and Exploration of Significant Artistic Influences

A Statement of Intent for one of these plans (attached) - Complete the attached statement of intent in your VAPD.

In your interview you will need to clearly outline your *present* intentions conceptually and materially. You may have a number of ideas at this stage or just one.

In planning you might consider:

- Conceptual Practice An idea, intention, theme, genre, interest or concept (ideas/aesthetic properties) What is your work communicating?
- Material Practice The expressive form, materials, style or technique (actions/physical properties) e.g. Drawings, photographs, text, collected images, sources of inspiration, artworks, artists, materials. How does your work demonstrate an understanding of artistic conventions and other artists practices.
- The Conceptual Framework artist, artwork, world and audience. What does your work communicate about the world or you to an audience? What does the artwork communicate about your knowledge of art conventions and traditions.
- The Frames Subjective, Structural, Cultural and/or Postmodern
- Subjective characteristics e.g. Expression of psychological, physical or spiritual experiences
- Structural characteristics e.g. Composition, Aesthetics, Elements and principles of design, genre.
- Cultural characteristics e.g. Gender, religion, culture.
- Postmodern characteristics in your work e.g. Irony, paradox, parody, appropriation, pastiche or intertextuality-How does your work demonstrate your knowledge of art conventions, practices and tradition? As students of Visual Arts this is an important question to consider. Does your work challenge? Does it juxtapose images/icons to create new meanings? Are you recontextualising?

- 8. Influences (artists, art movements and research)
- 9. Artmaking to date
- 10. Reflection
