Task Context:	
In this topic you have learnt about;

In this task you will be required to use the knowledge gained from studying these topics in class in addition to your own independent research discuss how negative family environments can influence and impact on child growth and development, in relation to the provided scenario.

Task Description:

Examine the following scenario and respond to the 3 questions provided;

Michael is a 3-year-old boy who lives with his parents, Lisa and David, in a small apartment. Lisa and David have been experiencing ongoing domestic violence, including physical abuse. The violent incidents often occur in Michael's presence, exposing him to a hostile and unsafe environment. Lisa and David's relationship has become increasingly strained, and they struggle with substance abuse issues.

Michael's physical appearance has raised concerns among his preschool teachers. He frequently arrives with unexplained bruises, and his overall hygiene and grooming are neglected. In the classroom, Michael displays withdrawn and fearful behaviours. He often avoids eye contact, and his speech is





limited compared to his peers. During playtime, he exhibits aggressive tendencies, hitting and biting other children when he feels threatened.

You are required to;

- 1. Provide a 1 paragraph <u>summary</u> outlining the details evident in the scenario, including all concerns relating to Michael's growth and development.
- 2. <u>Identify</u> the negative family environment factor/s present in the scenario and <u>explain</u> how they have impacted and/or will impact Michael's growth and development. Remember to specifically link the negative impacts to all areas of development (physical, social-emotional, cognitive and language development). Use examples from the scenario to support your discussion.
- 3. <u>Describe</u> the role of child welfare agencies and reporting mechanisms in ensuring the safety and well-being of children in abusive environments.
