

Stage 4 have been enjoying reading the novel *Crow Country* by Kate Constable in English this term. Shanaya Buick in Year 8 completed this book review about the novel.


Book Review - *Crow Country* by Kate Constable by Shanaya Buick

Have you ever wondered how the society that we live in has been shaped because of its bases of racism? *Crow Country* by Kate Constable shows this exceptionally. In this crime fantasy fiction book it covers racism and Aboriginal culture in a refreshing way, showing how a white person is affected by her Grandfather's actions in an age appropriate book targeted towards high schoolers.

In this book, we follow Sadie, a teenage girl trying to navigate her way through her new town while trying to solve the mystery of the town's - and her families - past.

This book is incredible. From its high tension moments, to its heartwarming coming of age story line, everything fits and flows effortlessly. We see Sadie conflicted, confused, having to make decisions on the fly with little-to-no guidance. The anticipation and tension that Kate Constable bleeds into the pages brings so much anxiety and yearning to the reader that they can't help but read on. She does this with an effortless charm that is present through all of Constable's previous works. She includes characters and events that most-to-all Australian youth can relate to and empathise with. She brings in events that Australian culture was built off of, such as racism and discrimination, in a way that holds the intensity of these events while keeping it age appropriate which I've seen other writers struggle with. She brings these issues to the forefront of the book in a unique way, rather than having an Aboriginal character being the protagonist, we see a white girl, struggling with her late Grandfather's previous actions and the racism that is still present in society, even after all these years, that effects the people that she cares about. While doing this, she includes crucial aspects of Aboriginal culture that some don't understand or don't find importance in, for example Dreamtime stories. Constable does this by centering the book around it, while still telling a captivating story - giving this book an edge over other books that deal with the same issues.

Overall, *Crow Country* by Kate Constable is a unique and refreshing book that tackles social issues while simultaneously telling a heartfelt story about a girl, Sadie, opening her mind and getting a further understanding of her family's and Australia's dark past. This book shows the perspective of a young person, finding out about her Grandfather's subtly racist past and trying to right the wrongs that he committed in a kind, yet at times, reckless, way. In conclusion, I not only would recommend all high school age students to read this book but I would (and most likely will) reread this book again in a heartbeat.



Science

They had to investigate an experiment, conduct the experiment, write it as a scientific report and write an evaluation of the process. Topics like 'the reactions between coke and mentos' and 'how the temperature of a liquid will make a balloon inflate and deflate' were explored.

The student research project promotes student inquiry, independent research and links the skills of working scientifically to the context of student's interests.

Conducting independent research is the best way for a student to demonstrate scientific skills. The more opportunities students have to use or practise these skills, the more capable they become at scientific research.

Stage 4 Science with Mrs Holmes

Stage 4NS1 have been having an 'electrifying' time exploring electricity and energy transformations. We experimented with creating different circuits using switches and bulbs.



As part of our assessment task we spent one morning exploring household chemicals and resources to complete science experiments where we could identify energy changes. We made Ice Cream Spiders (which were very tasty), explored Food Colouring in Milk and everyone's favourite we made slime.


The students will come up to the school in Term 4 for further days to assist them with transition.


The students are working hard to complete their assessment tasks and finalise in-class projects.


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
